The University Heights Fire Department recently received a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant for \$81,888. This grant was awarded to our fire department to purchase state of the art smoke detectors for the residents of University Heights. These First Alert smoke and fire alarms provide both ionization and photoelectric sensors in one unit. Ionization sensors may respond slightly faster to flaming fires, whereas photoelectric sensors may respond slightly faster to smoldering fires. Additionally, these alarms are provided with a ten year lithium battery.
