## Message from the Mayor

Dear Residents,

I hope you are having a good summer. I am happy to report that construction of the new community park on Fenwick Road will begin this fall. By this time next year, you will have a new park to visit and enjoy!

The first day of classes for the high school will be Monday, August 31. The Police Chief and I believe that additional permit parking for streets near the high school will help with traffic control and pedestrian safety. Please know that establishing permit parking requires City Council action.

Police Chief Steven Hammett and I will meet with residents in August to talk about changes in traffic patterns in the vicinity of the high school. We will also answer any additional safety questions you may have. Two meetings are scheduled to accommodate your busy schedules: Monday, August 3 and Monday, August 10. Both meetings will be at 7 p.m. in City Hall.

Residents who live on streets serviced by the Cleveland Heights Water Department, located in the northwest section of University Heights, have contacted me with concerns about their future water service. I attended the presentation at the Cleveland Heights Community Center, held May 26, about the possible privatization of water service delivery in Cleveland Heights. Additionally, I have been in communication with Cleveland Heights City Manager Tanisha Briley and Cleveland’s Interim Water Commissioner Alex Margevicius about this issue. Currently, about 800 homes and businesses in our city receive bills from the Cleveland Heights Water Department and would be affected by any changes in service delivery or cost. I have asked our Law Director to review all avenues to ensure that the interests of these 800 University Heights customers are protected.

Although the summer weather has not been conducive to lounging around the pool, please remember that the pool water at Purvis Park is heated. Even if the air temperature is not warm, you can still enjoy some water exercise in relative comfort. I hope to see you there!
