You may have seen our new sidewalk snowplow in action during recent snowfalls. The sidewalk plows go into action after the snow is plowed from streets. They first clear sidewalks in school areas and near houses of worship before clearing sidewalks in other residential areas. It takes two days for our sidewalk snowplows to clear snow from sidewalks citywide.

Construction Projects will occur on many streets this summer

This will be a heavy construction year in our city and I apologize in advance for the disruption this may cause you and your family. We will do our best to make sure the disruption in your daily lives is reduced as much as possible. Updates will be published in the newsletter and posted on the city website once we have information on the timing of these projects. The waterline and gas line replacement projects will replace old and outdated pipes that service homes and businesses in our city with brand new lines. The road paving and curb replacement projects will improve the condition and appearance of our streets.

Waterline replacement will occur on these streets:

- Loyola Road
- Churchill Blvd

Gas line replacement, with construction in the sidewalk/tree lawn area, will occur on:

- Washington Blvd, from Vernon to Saybrook
- Bushnell Road, from Fenwick to Warrensville
- Warrensville Center Road, from the Boston Market restaurant to City Hall
- Fenwick Road, from Bushnell to Northwood
- Northwood Road
- Silsby Road, from Edgerton to the east side of Warrensville Center Road

Repaving will occur on several streets:

- Raymont Blvd
- Wynn Road
- Cedarbrook Road
- Cranston Road
- Hillbrook Road, from Meadowbrook to Fenwick
- Eaton Road
- Miramar Blvd
- Groveland Road, from Wrenford to Milton

New curbs will be installed on several streets:

- Eaton
- Hillbrook Road, from Meadowbrook to Fenwick
- Meadowbrook Blvd, from Warrensville to Washington
- Miramar Blvd
- Silsby Road, from Belvoir to Milton
