Leaf season is upon us and the Service Department crews will begin collecting leaves from your tree lawn on Monday, October 16. The vacuum trucks will circle the city 6-7 times over the next few months until mid-December. Simply rake your leaves into a pile on your tree lawn for collection by the leaf trucks, or put them into brown yard waste bags for pick-up on your garbage day. When raking, please remember to keep the leaves on your tree lawn so that they do not clog the street drains. Thank you—and happy raking!

Many of your homes are already beautifully decorated with fall and holiday themes. Your efforts are delightful and are enjoyed by your neighbors and visitors to our city. They may even result in an award from the city for holiday decorating! Thank you for sharing your love of the season and please know that your decorating talents are appreciated.

The city’s semi-annual collection of household hazardous waste and free paper shredding event will take place on the weekend the clocks change on Friday, November 3, from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. and on Saturday, November 4, from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m.

Although the 2017 construction season is nearing completion, I have news about two construction projects scheduled for next year. We recently learned that the Cleveland Water Department will replace the waterline on Washington Blvd, north of Cedar Road, and the waterline on Groveland, between Milton and Green Roads, in 2018. The Washington Blvd waterline replacement is a joint project of the cities of University Heights and Cleveland Heights. We are very excited that the Cleveland Water Department selected Groveland and Washington for these significant public improvement projects. The construction work will be bid in the winter and I will have more details on the timing of these projects once the bid is awarded.

The Cleveland Metroparks are hosting a fishing event at the Ohio & Erie Canal Metroparks Reservation in Cuyahoga Heights on Saturday, October 14, from 9 a.m. – 1 p.m. This is a free event with prizes in several categories. No pre-registration is necessary, however a valid Ohio fishing license is required for anyone over age 16. Bring your rod, tackle and a cooler to store your “catch of the day” or use the Metroparks’ loaner rods and bait; quantities are available while supplies last.

Enjoy a Saturday evening hayride this month at the Metroparks’ Mill Stream Run Reservation in Strongsville. Hayrides and family entertainment can be found at the Chalet Recreation Area from 6 p.m. – 10 p.m. on October 7, 14, 21 and 28.



### Election Day is Tuesday, Nov. 7<sup>th</sup>

### Make an Emergency Kit for Your Car

The Cuyahoga County Office of Emergency Management supports emergency planning efforts with community partners and stakeholders. As we head into the winter months with possible cold weather events, the city is partnering with them to recommend various ways to keep yourself and your family safe. One of those recommendations is to make an emergency kit for your car. We certainly hope that you will not need these items but planning for the unexpected emergency is a good practice. Your emergency kit should include:

- Ice scraper and shovel
- Jumper cables, flares and a reflective triangle
- Flashlights with extra batteries and a cell phone charger
- A first aid kit with necessary medications
- Warm clothes, hats, mittens; sleeping bag or blanket; diapers for babies
- A basic toolkit and battery or hand-cranked radio
- Cat litter or sand for better tire traction
- Water, baby formula, and non-perishable food plus a manual can-opener
