    - 2. Motion By Mrs. Urban, Seconded by Mr. Fine to condition any and all other approvals given this evening relating to demolition, consolidation of the lots, variances and site plan approval upon 1) compliance with the requirements set forth in Mr. Ciuni's letter of June 3, 2021; 2) the entry by the applicant into a development agreement with the City.
    - 3. Motion by Mr. Siemborski, Seconded by Mr. Rach to Approve the Demolition of Houses located at 14499 Summerfield; 2392, 2402, 2414, 2420 and 2424 So. Green Road

- 5. Motion by Mr. Fine, Seconded by Mr. Siemborski for Use of Yards for Accessory Off-Street Parking and Loading: Minimum allowable Rear Yard Parking/Driving Setback is 30', proposed setback is between 12ft. and 15ft. requiring a Rear Yard Parking/Driving Setback Variance of 18ft.
